The Lincoln Institution and the Educational Home for Boys had their annual excursion to Atlantic City on Saturday last, given them by the liberality of the Camden and Atlantic Railroad Company. They were very kindly received at Atlantic by Mr. Trenwith, of the Excursion House, who gave them the use of his house and grounds. The day was too cool for much bathing, but the boys were not at a loss to know how to amuse themselves, and they rambled along the beach, hunting for shells and other curiosities. In the afternoon the line of stages, of which Mayor Gardner is the president, gave them a ride through the city. Captain Gale of the yacht *Neptune* offered to take them out in his yacht for a sail. Although they would have gone gladly, it was not thought prudent, as the sea was very rough. They returned in the 4:40 train, having spent a very pleasant day.
